A young cantor in the service of Cardinal Philippe d'Alençon, in the early 1390s the Franco-Flemish Jehan de Chywongne (in Latin, Johannes Ciconia) was in Rome where absorbed the polyphonic style of the Papal Chapel – not least that of Antonio Zacara da Teramo. After d'Alençon's death in 1397, however, he found new employment in northern Italy, first perhaps in Lucca and Milan, then certainly in Padua from 1402. There he served the jurist and clergyman Francesco Zabarella at the Padua Cathedral until his early death in 1412.

Addressed to specialized singers and instrumentalists selected through an international contest, the Seminar will particularly focus on Ciconia's ceremonial motets and on the relationship between the composer's counterpoint and his own theoretical writings.

Main lecturers and coachers will be Barbara Zanichelli and Pedro Memelsdorff, assisted by musicologists including Francesco Zimei and Anna Zayaruznaya.

Call for applications

The call addresses young professional or semi-professional singers and instrumentalists specialized in late-medieval or renaissance repertoires.

- A declaration of full commitment to attend the Seminar during every of the indicated days (23–27 June 2025), if selected;
- A declaration of agreement to perform a non-commercial, recorded public concert at the end of the seminar.

Scholarships

All selected musicians will be covered for: enrolment fee; accommodation in single rooms (max four nights); partial board; and travel (economy class tickets and up to a maximum of EUR 700 per person).

Travel must be agreed with, and purchased by, the seminars' secretariat.

The seminar can be accessed free of charge by listeners upon request and approval of the secretariat.
